

#### **Hospice Palliative Care**




Hospice Palliative Care aims to relieve suffering and improve the quality of living and dying. It strives to help individuals and families to:

- Address physical, psychological, social, spiritual and practical issues, and their associated expectations, needs, hopes and fears
- Prepare for and manage end-of-life choices and the dying process
- Cope with loss and grief
- Treat all active issues
- Prevent new issues from occurring
- Promote opportunities for meaningful and valuable experiences, and personal and spiritual growth

#### **Hospice Palliative Care...**

- May enhance other types of care or may be the total focus of care
- Is delivered by an inter-professional team
- Is integrated at the clinical, organizational and overall system level
- Is person and family-centred
- Includes end-of-life care, but is not limited to the time immediately preceding death

## Deaths in NSM 2010





# Palliative and End-of-Life Care Provincial Roundtable Report & Announcement of the Ontario Palliative Care Network (OPCN) March, 2016

- Minister Hoskins tasked Parliamentary Assistant John Fraser to support the development of a comprehensive strategy for palliative and end-of-life care
- Recommendations;
  - 1. Expand equitable access for all Ontarians and integrate
  - 2. Strengthen service and provider capacity
  - 3. Improve caregiver supports
  - 4. Enhance public education and awareness
  - 5. Establish and improve oversight and accountability
    - Establish the OPCN

#### The Ontario Palliative Care Network (OPCN)

- Partnership of community stakeholders, health service providers and health systems planners developing a coordinated, standardized approach to palliative care services regionally across the province
- Joint leadership between the 14 LHINs and Cancer Care Ontario
- New regional governance structure for palliative care
- Mandate is to serve as principal advisor to the government for high quality, coordinated palliative care in Ontario
